Biking	<p>Besides hiking, biking is one of the most beloved activities on Mount Desert Island. Much of that has to do with the Carriage Trails. John D. Rockefeller created 57 miles of these carless crushed stone roads so that he could ride his horse drawn carriage without having to worry about other automobiles. The roads are fantastic for bike riding, hiking, or even horseback riding. The Carriage Roads are throughout the park, but some of the more popular spots to start are at the north side of Eagle Lake, Jordan Pond, and Hulls Cove Visitor Center. Boat Tours	<p>Boat tours are one of the best ways to see Acadia and Mount Desert Island. They are great all times of the day and year. We recommend to make your reservations for boat tours prior to arrival as some will sell out in July, August, and September. Whale Watching is good between mid-April to October. Most boat tours are located by the Bar Harbor Town Pier. Some tours offer parking, but many do not. We suggest walking to the tour or taking the Island Explorer to avoid parking issues. This is an excellent way to get around the Island.
